

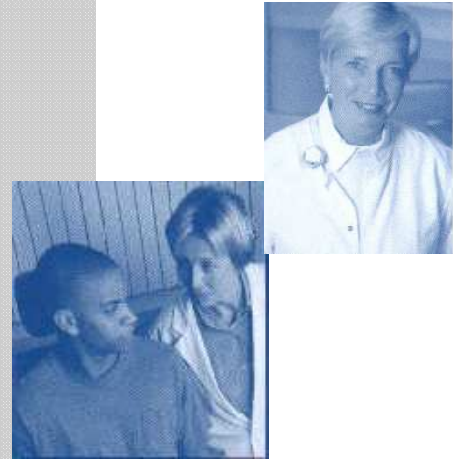

It offers strategies to address common barriers to effective asthma self-management: lack of understanding, competing health beliefs and intentional non-adherence.

Dr. George is Associate Professor of Nursing in the Columbia University School of Nursing. She has worked as an advanced practice nurse in lung disease since 1986. She lectures extensively on issues related to asthma care and education and has published original research in these areas.
